Appanah, Nathacha	<i>The Last Brother</i> – A man from Mauritius, an island in the Indian Ocean, tells of his friendship with a Jewish refugee that changed his life when he was a boy.
Bauermeister, Erica	<i>The School of Essential Ingredients</i> – Eight students gather every Monday night for cooking class, but each one seeks a recipe for something beyond the kitchen.
Connelly, Michael	<i>Mickey Haller Novels</i> - Follow L.A. defense attorney Mickey Haller, whose "office" is the back seat of his car, as he defends clients who may be innocent.
Edgarian, Carol	<i>The Three Stages of Amazement</i> – A San Francisco couple tries to hold their marriage together through personal and economic crises.
Goethe, Johann Wolfgang von	<i>Faust (translated by Stuart Atkins)</i> – In this classic play a man makes a deal with the devil.
Jordan, Hillary	<i>Mudbound</i> – In 1946, a woman tries to adjust after moving with her husband and two children to an isolated cotton farm in the Mississippi Delta.
Lehane, Dennis	<i>Moonlight Mile</i> - PIs Patrick and Angela found abducted 4-year old Amanda 12 years ago and now must try to do the same when she disappears again (6 th in the Patrick Kenzie and Angela Gennaro mysteries)
Moore, Graham	<i>The Sherlockian</i> — A Sherlock Holmes enthusiast investigates a murder related to the author's missing diary, while in the 1890s Conan Doyle hunts a serial killer.
McCall Smith, Alexander	<i>The Saturday Big Tent Wedding Party</i> – Hoping to reclaim a van that was featured in a possibly prophetic dream, Precious and Grace investigate a cattle poisoning. (12 th in the No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency Series)
Obreht, Téa.	<i>The Tiger's Wife</i> – A doctor in a war-torn Balkan country looks for answers about her grandfather, who told her tales of an escaped tiger and a deathless man.
Pearson, Allison	<i>I Think I Love You</i> - A middle-aged woman discovers more than twenty years after the fact that she won an all-expense-paid trip to meet David Cassidy.

Picoult, Jodi	<i>Sing You Home</i> – A music therapist and her partner want to start a family, but her ex-husband stands in the way by suing for custody of their embryos.
Preston, Douglas & Child, Lincoln	<i>Gideon's Sword</i> – Gideon, after exacting revenge for his father's death, joins organization that does covert work for the government.
Strout, Elizabeth	<i>Olive Kitteridge</i> – Thirteen linked stories introduce the inhabitants of Crosby, Maine and retired Math teacher Olive Kitteridge.
Simonson, Helen	<i>Major Pettigrew's Last Stand</i> – An old-fashioned English widower bonds with a Pakistani shop-owner, despite interference from their families.
Toibin, Colm	Brooklyn - Leaving Ireland to work in 1950's Brooklyn, Eilis Lacey is building a new life for herself when devastating news from home threatens her happiness.
Wiesel, Elie	<i>The Sonderberg Case</i> – Covering the murder trial of a German expatriate, a Jewish theater critic reflects on his own family history.

Atwood, Kathryn J.	<i>Women Heroes of World War II</i> - Twenty six stories about women from eight different countries who played a role in fighting the Nazis during WW II.
Bartlett, Allison Hoover	<i>The Man Who Loved Books Too Much</i> – This is the tale of a thief whose obsession was rare books and his pursuer, a book dealer-turned-amateur detective.
Couric, Katie	<i>The Best Advice I Ever Got</i> – The anchor of CBS evening news collects the best life tips from a host of accomplished leaders, thinkers, artists and others.
Ephron, Nora	<i>I Remember Nothing</i> — A collection of essays about growing older by the acclaimed director and screenwriter.
Fey, Tina	Bossypants - The breakout star of "Saturday Night Live" and "30 Rock" gives a humorous account of her life and behind-the-scenes stories from her hit shows.
Grennan, Conor	<i>Little Princes</i> — The author tells of his work at an orphanage in war-torn Nepal where many of his young charges are victims rescued from human traffickers.
Orenstein, Peggy	<i>Cinderella Ate My Daughter</i> - Reveals the dark side of pink and pretty for young girls and offers ways to prevent raising daughters who only care about image.
Postman, Neil	Building a Bridge to the Eighteenth Century – Explores the key ideas that emerged out of philosophy and science in this era and their relevance today.
Schiff, Stacey	<i>Cleopatra</i> - Reconstructs the life of the most influential woman of her era, revealing Cleopatra as a complex woman and shrewd monarch.
