Fiction

- Anderson, Laurie Halse *Speak* - A traumatic event at a summer party has a devastating effect on a young girl's first year of high school.
- Ebershoff, David *The 19th Wife* - The story of Brigham Young's 19th wife intertwines with a tale of murder involving a polygamist family in present-day Utah.
- Fortier, Anne *Juliet* - In Siena, Julie Jacobs discovers she is descended from Giulietta Tomei, whose tragic love story inspired Shakespeare, as she searches for an inheritance.
- Goolrick, Robert *A Reliable Wife* - In 19th century Wisconsin, a troubled businessman's ad for a wife is answered by a woman who has her own dark secrets.
- Gowda, Shilpi Somaya *The Secret Daughter* - Interweaves the stories of a baby girl in India, the American doctor who adopted her and the Indian mother who gave her up.
- Gregory, Philippa *Wideacre* - An 18th century woman will use any means necessary to secure for herself and her children the beloved family estate of Wideacre.
- Jacobs, Kate *Comfort Food* - A celebrity chef tries to distance herself from her overly dependent loved ones and re-make her career as she approaches her 50th birthday.
- Jacobs, Kate *The Friday Night Knitting Club* - At their weekly knitting club, friends share the challenges of raising children, navigating careers, and pursuing relationships.
- Larsson, Stieg *Millennium Trilogy (The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo; The Girl Who Played with Fire; The Girl Who Kicked the Hornets Nest)* - Follows a troubled Goth hacker and a journalist as they investigate the sordid side of Swedish society.
- Lavigne, Michael *Not Me* - Tells the dramatic and surprising stories of two men, father and son, through sixty years of uncertain memory, distorted history and assumed identity.
- Lee, Harper *To Kill a Mockingbird* - A girl's father defends a black man accused of raping a white woman in a small Alabama town during the 1930s.

Meacham, Leila	<i>Roses</i> – This multigenerational family saga, set in east Texas, charts the transformation of a wide-eyed heiress into a calculating cotton plantation queen.
Patterson, James	<i>I, Alex Cross</i> - Detective Alex Cross' investigation into his niece's murder takes him into the powerful, protected, and decadent world of the Washington elite.
Pintoff, Stefanie	<i>In the Shadow of Gotham</i> – In 1904, a detective takes on the case of a Columbia graduate student murdered while visiting her aunt in Westchester County.
Pintoff, Stefanie	<i>A Curtain Falls</i> - In this sequel to <i>In the Shadow of Gotham</i> , the murders of three Broadway actresses are investigated in turn of the 20 th century New York.
Steel, Danielle	<i>Rogue</i> - An amicably divorced couple confronts a life-changing choice after a devastating earthquake.
Verghese, Abraham	<i>Cutting for Stone</i> - Twin brothers who share a love of medicine come of age in an Ethiopia on the brink of revolution, until they are driven apart by betrayal.
Weir, Alison	<i>Captive Queen</i> – Abandoning her marriage to the king of France for Henry II of England, Eleanor of Aquitaine experiences a tumultuous and influential reign.

Non- Fiction

Hirsi Ali, Ayaan	<i>Infidel</i> – Hirsi Ali, a Somali-born member of the Dutch parliament, tells of her life and her internal struggle with her Muslim faith.
Hirsi Ali, Ayaan	<i>Nomad</i> - Hirsi Ali tells of her coming to America to build a new life, an ocean away from the death threats made to her by European Islamists.
Lindsey, Hal	<i>The Late Great Planet Earth</i> - Published in the 1970s, this book contains Lindsey's insights into biblical prophecy.
Skloot, Rebecca	<i>The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks</i> – The story of a cell line used in research around the world and the woman from whom the cells were taken.
Spelling , Tori	<i>Mommywood</i> - Tori Spelling tells stories of her life as a mom in Hollywood and her own childhood in the limelight.
von Drehle, David	<i>Triangle: The Fire That Changed America</i> - The story of the New York City Triangle Shirtwaist factory and the fire that killed 146 workers on March 25, 1911.
