Barry, Brunonia	<i>The Lace Reader</i> - When her great-aunt disappears, a woman returns home to Salem 15 years after fleeing to California under troubling circumstances.
Cameron, Michelle	<i>The Fruit of Her Hands</i> - Traces the life of a Jewish woman, who was educated like a son by her father, amid the rising anti-Semitism in 13th century Europe.
Cleave, Chris	<i>Little Bee</i> - Presents the tale of an illegal Nigerian refugee and a recent widow from suburban London and the tragedy that brought them together.
Cross, Donna Woolfolk	Pope Joan – Born in 814, Joan dons her dead brother's clothes, assumes a man's identity, and gains respect and authority as well as the title of pope.
Donoghue, Emma	Room – To 5 year-old Jack Room is the entire world. It is where he was born and grew up; but to his mother it is her prison of 7 years.
Glass, Julia	<i>The Widower's Tale</i> - A cantankerous widower's life changes when he allows a progressive pre-school to open in his barn.
Larsson, Stieg	<i>The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo</i> - Set in Sweden, a journalist and a Goth hacker team up to investigate a 40 year old disappearance.
Lavigne, Michael	Not Me – Tells the dramatic and surprising stories of two men, father and son, through sixty years of uncertain memory, distorted history, and assumed identity.
Maynard, Joyce	<i>The Good Daughter</i> - The fortunes of two families are entwined through their youngest daughters, who were born on the same day in the same hospital.
Orringer, Julie	The Invisible Bridge - An epic tale of three Jewish brothers from Hungry whose

lives are torn apart by World War II.

Patchett, Ann	Run - A traffic accident and an act of bravery bring two very different families together and changes their lives.
Verghese, Abraham	<i>Cutting for Stone</i> - Twin brothers who share a love of medicine come of age in an Ethiopia on the brink of revolution, until they are driven apart by betrayal.
Walls, Jeanette	<i>Half Broke Horses</i> – A novel based on the life of the author's grandmother, who learned to break horses in childhood and went on to run a vast ranch in Arizona.
