Furnivall, Kate

Heller, Joseph

Something Happened - Although Bob Slocum was living the American dream, he found himself discontent and desolate until...something happened.

McCullough, Colleen

The Independence of Miss Mary Bennet - This is a sequel to *Pride and Prejudice* that finds the third Bennet sister setting out in pursuit of adventure.

Michaels, Fern

Jury - When Paula Woodley has had enough of her abusive husband, she turns to the women of the Sisterhood, an organization where women bring about justice. Fourth in the ***Revenge of the Sisterhood*** series

Miller, Risa

Welcome to Heavenly Heights - A group of Jewish Americans emigrate to a West Bank settlement and find not only the order that they seek, but unexpected and spontaneous acts of violence.

Patterson, Richard North

Exile - A successful attorney's life is thrown into turmoil when he is reunited with a Palestinian woman with whom he had a secret love affair in law school.

Rosnay, Tatiana de

Sarah's Key - On the sixtieth anniversary of the 1942 roundup of Paris Jews, an American journalist embarks on an investigation that leads her to long-hidden family secrets and to the ordeal of Sarah, a young girl caught up in the raid.

Schlink, Bernhard

The Reader - Post WW II Germany, a law student discovers his former lover possibly committed a heinous crime during the war.

Wagenstein, Angel

Isaac's Torah - Isaac Jacob Blumenthal survives concentration camps, a Siberian gulag, two world wars, and more by masquerading as a fool.

Yates, Richard *Revolutionary Road* – The story of a bright, beautiful and talented couple living in suburbia during the 50s, whose marriage and life is filled with discontent and disillusionment.

Zafon, Carlos Ruiz *The Shadow of the Wind* - A boy enjoys a book so much that he searches for the rest of the author's works, only to discover that someone is destroying every book the author has ever written..

Non-Fiction

Cunningham, Laura *Sleeping Arrangements* – This is the memoir of an orphaned Bronx girl who was raised by two eccentric uncles in the 1950's.

Ewen, Elizabeth *Immigrant Women in the Land of Dollars: Life and Culture on the Lower East Side 1890-1925* – Portrays the lives of Jewish and Italian immigrant women in New York at the turn of the century.

Koppel, Lily *The Red Leather Diary*- Rescued from a dumpster on the Upper West Side of Manhattan, a discarded diary brings to life the glamorous, forgotten world of an extraordinary young woman in the early 1930's.

Madigan, Tom *I Am Proud of You: My Friendship with Fred Rogers* – A journalist recalls how an encounter with this TV icon led to a wondrous, life-changing friendship.

Thomas, Dana *Deluxe: How Luxury Lost It's Luster* – Digs deep into the dark side of the luxury industry to uncover all the secrets that Prada, Gucci, and Burberry don't want you to know.

Tonello, Michael *Bringing Home the Birkin* - An insider's hilarious, whirlwind account of his years spent globe-trotting in search of the holy grail of handbags - the Birkin.

Spencer, Lloyd *Introducing the Enlightenment* – Introduction to the individuals, events and concepts that defined the age with pen and ink drawings. Part of a series by Totem Books that looks at various famous people, ideas and fields of study.
