Furnivall, Kate

Heller, Joseph

Something Happened - Although Bob Slocum was living the American dream,

he found himself discontent and desolate until...something happened.

McCullough, Colleen *The Independence of Miss Mary Bennet* - This is a sequel to Pride and Prejudice that finds the third Bennet sister setting out in pursuit of adventure.

Michaels, Fern

Jury - When Paula Woodley has had enough of her abusive husband, she turns to the women of the Sisterhood, an organization where women bring about justice.

Fourth in the **Revenge of the Sisterhood** series

Miller, Risa *Welcome to Heavenly Heights* – A group of Jewish Americans emigrate to a West Bank settlement and find not only the order that they seek, but unexpected and spontaneous acts of violence.

Patterson, Richard North *Exile* - A successful attorney's life is thrown into turmoil when he is reunited with a Palestinian woman with whom he had a secret love affair in law school.

Zafon, Carlos Ruiz The Shadow of the Wind - A boy enjoys a book so much that he searches for

the rest of the author's works, only to discover that someone is destroying every

book the author has ever written..
