Albom, Mitch	<i>The First Phone Call From Heaven</i> – In a Michigan town various people begin receiving phone calls from deceased loved ones - but is it a hoax or a miracle?
Balson, Ronald	Once We Were Brothers -A respected civic leader and philanthropist is accused of being a Nazi SS officer by a man whose family took him in as a child.
Bohjalian, Chris	<i>Midwives</i> – Isolated by a snowstorm a midwife performs an emergency C-section on a woman she claims was dead and finds herself on trial for murder.
Cantor, Jillian	<i>Margot</i> –Anne Frank's sister survives WWII and is living under an assumed name in Philadelphia when events force her to confront her past.
Coleman, Reed Farrel	<i>Moe Prager Mysteries</i> – Hard-boiled detective novels starring a former NYPD cop turned P.I set in late 20th-century New York.
Collins, Suzanne	<i>The Hunger Games</i> – In a dystopian future, 16 year old Katniss faces death when she takes her sister's place in an annual televised survival competition.
Connelly, Michael	<i>The Gods of Guilt</i> – A defense attorney investigates the murder of a former client, a prostitute he thought he had rescued, but whom he may have put in danger instead. (Mickey Haller Novels #6)
Conroy, Pat	<i>South of Broad</i> – After his brother's suicide, a young man struggles alone until he develops a diverse circle of friends in Charleston, South Carolina.
Crichton, Robert	Secret of Santa Vittoria- An Italian mountain village tries to protect its hoard of wine from German soldiers near the end of World War II.
Delinsky, Barbara	<i>Sweet Salt Air</i> – Two childhood friends reunite at a summer retreat, each harboring a horrible secret that would test the bounds of their longtime relationship if revealed.
Faye, Lyndsay	Seven For a Secret– Six months after NYPD was founded, an officer investigates a criminal ring who kidnaps free people of color in the North to sell in the South.
Flagg, Fannie	The All-Girl Filling Station's Last Reunion- A middle-aged woman receives old

documents that turn her world and her beliefs about her family topsy-turvy.

Freedman, Colette	<i>The Affair</i> – The story of an infidelity told from the point of view of the three people involved – the husband, the wife and the other woman.
Gabhart, Ann H.	<i>The Outsider</i> – After her brother's death a young woman joins a Shaker community, but her loyalty to it is challenged when she meets a doctor who is an outsider.
(J.K. Rowling, writing as) Galbraith, Robert	<i>Cuckoo's Calling</i> A private investigator who lost his leg in Afghanistan takes the case of a legendary supermodel's suspicious suicide and sees the dark side of fame.
Green, John	<i>The Fault in Our Stars</i> – A teen with cancer has accepted her death until a meeting with a boy at cancer support group forces her to reexamine her perspective on life.
Hoffman, Alice	<i>The Dovekeepers</i> – The lives of four women intersect in the desperate days of the Roman siege on Masada in ancient Israel.
Kline, Christina Baker	Orphan Train – A foster teen performing community service finds out that the elderly, wealthy woman she is helping was sent west on an orphan train as a child.
Lamb, Wally	<i>We Are Water</i> –Follows a middle-age artist and her family as she, after twenty-seven years of marriage, divorces her husband to marry a female art dealer.
Martin, Charles	Unwritten - A reclusive Florida man grants a favor to one of his few friends and becomes involved in helping a troubled actress fake her own death.
McCall Smith, Alexander	<i>The Minor Adjustment Beauty Salon</i> - Botswana's No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency tries to discover who is spreading vicious rumors about a new beauty salon. (No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency #14).
Moore, Edward Kelsey	<i>The Supremes at Earl's All-You-Can-Eat</i> – Follows three friends who meet at a local eatery in Plainview, Indiana as times change and they grow up.
Moriarity, Liane	<i>The Husband's Secret</i> – Finding a letter to be opened only when her husband dies a woman is unable to resist reading it and discovers a life shattering secret.
Moyes, Jojo	<i>Me Before You</i> - As an assistant to a quadriplegic former extreme sports enthusiast, a young woman struggles with his acerbic moods and shocking plans for the future.
Nesbo, Joe	<i>The Police</i> – Oslo Police officers are being murdered at the crime scenes of earlier unsolved murders. (Detective Harry Hole Mysteries #10)
Pessl, Marisha	<i>Night Film</i> – When the daughter of a cult horror film director apparently commits suicide a disgraced journalist probes the strange circumstances surrounding her death.
Ragen, Naomi	<i>The Sisters Weiss</i> – When she discovers the truth about her Aunt, who committed an unforgivable act, a woman from an ultra-Orthodox family sets off to find her.
Riggle, Kristina	<i>Keepsake</i> – A mother whose hoarding behavior has led to her child being injured must accept help from her sister and face their shared history.
Sendker, Jan Philipp	<i>The Art of Hearing Heartbeats</i> – When her father goes missing a woman travels to Burma to find him after discovering an old love letter to a woman there.

Segal, Francesca	<i>The Innocents</i> – A man must choose between duty and passion when, after becoming engaged to his girlfriend of 12 years, he finds himself drawn to her cousin.
Silver, Elizabeth L.	<i>Execution of Noa P. Singleton</i> – A death-row inmate who never spoke in her own defense shares her history and the events surrounding the murder she committed.
Sittenfeld, Curtis	<i>Sisterland</i> – A woman goes on TV to predict a earthquake will hit the St. Louis area, to the horror of her twin sister who has spent her life hiding her own psychic gift.
Smith, Lee	<i>Guests on Earth</i> – A young orphaned girl is sent to a North Carolina mental hospital in 1936 and receives innovative treatment alongside Zelda Fitzgerald.
Stedman, M.L.	<i>The Light Between Oceans</i> – When a childless couple finds a baby on their remote Australian island, the decision they make has far-reaching repercussions.
Thomson, James Whitfield	<i>Lies You Wanted to Hear</i> – An ill-matched married couple is torn apart by lies that lead to a momentous decision that changes their lives and those of their children
Walter, Jess	<i>Beautiful Ruins</i> – Follows a young Italian innkeeper and his almost-love affair with a beautiful American starlet which draws him into a glittering world.
Witterick, J. L.	<i>My Mother's Secret</i> – Based on a true story, a Polish mother and daughter risk their lives to shelter two Jewish families and a defecting German soldier during WWII.
Zusak, Markus	<i>The Book Thief</i> - With Death as narrator, this novel follows Liesel Meminger, a young girl and book thief, through the fear-filled years of Nazi Germany.

Capote, Truman	<i>In Cold Blood</i> - This true-crime classic plumbs the psychological and emotional depths of a senseless quadruple murder in America's heartland.
Fuhrman, Mark & Weeks, Stephen	<i>Murder in Greenwich</i> – A former LAPD homicide detective investigates the unsolved brutal homicide of teenaged Martha Moxley.
Kabat-Zinn, Jon	<i>Wherever You Go There You Are</i> – A Professor of Medicine Emeritus describes different meditative practices and what they can do for the practitioner.
O'Reilly, Bill & Dugard, Martin	<i>Killing Kennedy</i> – A historical narrative of the shocking events surrounding the assassination of John F. Kennedy told by the popular conservative talk-show host.
