Brookner, Anita	<i>Latecomers</i> – Two lifelong friends, parted from their parents when they are brought out of Nazi Germany, respond differently to the pain of separation.
Egan, Jennifer	<i>A Visit from the Goon Squad</i> – a former punk rocker and his assistant hide secrets while interacting with an assortment of equally troubled people.
Lehane, Dennis	<i>Given Day</i> – Follows the experiences of a family whose lives mirror the unrest surrounding the Boston Police Strike of 1919.
Meister, Ellen	<i>The Other Life</i> – A woman has the ability to cross into alternate realities where she has made different life decisions.
Morpurgo, Michael	<i>War Horse</i> – Joey the horse recalls growing up on an English farm and his struggle for survival as a cavalry horse during World War I.
Mohsin, Hamid	<i>The Reluctant Fundamentalist</i> - A young Muslim American's life is changed when the events of September 11 th force him to confront his personal allegiances.
Myers, Walter Dean	<i>Monster</i> – On trial as an accomplice to a murder, a sixteen-year-old records his experiences in the form of a film script.
Pintoff, Stefanie	<i>The Secret of the White Rose</i> – A NYPD detective and a criminologist investigate the murder of a judge during the anarchist riots of 1906. (3 rd in the New York Historical Mysteries Series)
Poole, Sara	<i>Poison</i> - Defying convention to become Cardinal Rodrigo Borgia's official poisoner, a woman pursues her father's murderer.
Roth, Philip	<i>Nemesis</i> – In 1944 Newark, a devoted playground director, sidelined from the war, watches in horror as the polio epidemic ravages the city's children.

Roy, Lori	Bent Road — A woman's move to her husband's hometown where his sister died under mysterious circumstances 20 years ago, is marred by a girl's disappearance.
Sachar, Louis	<i>Holes</i> – As further evidence of his family's bad fortune, Stanley Yelnats is sent to a hellish correctional camp in the Texas desert.
Simon, Rachel	<i>The Story of a Beautiful Girl</i> - A novel about a woman who can't speak, a man who is deaf, and a widow who finds herself suddenly caring for a newborn baby.
Stockett, Kathryn	<i>The Help</i> – 1962 Jackson, Mississippi, three women (two African-American maids and a young white woman) team up for a clandestine project.
Shteyngart, Gary	<i>Super Sad True Love Story</i> – In a near-future America that teeters on the edge of collapse, a 39-year-old man and a younger woman build a doomed relationship.
Vincenzi, Penny	<i>Something Dangerous</i> - Born into the powerful Lytton publishing family, twins Adele's and Venetia's world changes with the rise of Nazi Germany. (2 rd in the Spoils of Time trilogy)

Baksi, Kurdo	<i>Steig Larsson</i> – A friend of the author offers a look into the deceased author's life and the inspiration behind the characters in his Millennium Trilogy.
Foer, Joshua	<i>Moonwalking with Einstein</i> – U.S. Memory Champion Foer shows how anyone with enough training and determination can achieve mastery of their memory.
Larson, Erik	<i>The Devil in the White City</i> - The story of the architect involved in building the 1893 World's Fair and of the serial killer who murdered in its shadow.
Lucci, Susan	<i>All My Life</i> – The four-decade star of "All My Children" offers behind-the-scenes stories from the show and discusses the joys and heartaches of her life.
Forshaw, Barry	<i>The Man Who Left Too Soon</i> - The stranger-than-fiction life story of Steig Larsson, the author of The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo.
Miller, James Andrew	<i>Those Guys Have All the Fun</i> - Presents the history of sports channel ESPN based on interviews with nearly five hundred current and former employees.
Salisbury, Harrison E.	<i>900 Days</i> - A narrative of the siege of Leningrad by the Nazis based on documentary, archival evidence and interviews with survivors.
