Fiction

- Castle, Richard *Heat Wave* – A NYPD detective must deal with the presence of a magazine journalist as she works to solve a murder (based on the TV series **Castle**).
- Delinsky, Barbara *Escape* – A disillusioned lawyer impulsively abandons her husband and returns to a New Hampshire town where she spent a watershed summer during college.
- Donoghue, Emma *Room*– To 5 year-old Jack Room is the entire world. It is where he was born and grew up, but to his mother it is her prison of 7 years.
- Dueñas, Maria *The Time in Between* - Follows the story of a seamstress who becomes the most sought-after couturiere during the Spanish Civil War and World War II.
- Follett, Ken *Pillars of the Earth* - A tale of a twelfth-century monk driven to do the seemingly impossible: build the greatest Gothic cathedral the world has ever known.
- Gordon, Mary *The Love of My Youth* – Former lovers, reunited in Rome forty years after their romance ended, spend time together and reflect on the past.
- Griffiths, Elly *House at Sea's End* – A forensic archeologist tries to unravel the mystery of six WW II skeletons found buried on an English beach with their hands bound. (Ruth Galloway mysteries #3)
- Holt, Anne *1222* – Survivors of a train wreck, including a paralyzed former Swedish police investigator, are stranded by a blizzard in a lodge, a safe haven until a corpse is found.
- Hawley, Noah *The Good Father*– The story of a doctor's suspense-filled quest to unlock the mind of a suspected political assassin: his twenty-year old son. (Publication date 3/20/12)
- Indridason, Arnaldur *Jar City* – An Inspector investigates the murder of a 69 year old Reykjavik man and discovers a link to a series of rapes committed forty years earlier. (Erlendur Sveinsson mysteries #1).
- Jacobson, Howard *The Finkler Question* - A radio producer and a Jewish philosopher, friends since childhood, reminisce as they enter middle age.

| Landay, William | <i>Defending Jacob</i> – When his 14 year old son is charged with the murder of a fellow student an assistant district attorney is torn between loyalty and justice. |
| Lupton, Rosamund | <i>Sister</i> – Refusing to believe that her pregnant, artist sister committed suicide, Bee begins an obsessive search for the truth, despite being dismissed by the police. |
| McLain, Paula | <i>Paris Wife</i> - A novelization of the life of Ernest Hemingway with his first wife, Hadley, and their time spent in Jazz Age Paris. |
| Mina, Denise | <i>The End of Wasp Season</i> – A pregnant Detective Sergeant investigates a savage murder outside Glasgow and discovers a link to the suicide of a rich banker in Kent. (Alex Morrow novels #2) |
| Rockland, Kate | <i>150 Pounds</i> - After bloggers from opposite ends of the scale (Fat and Fabulous vs. Skinny Chick) clash on Oprah, life alters how they see themselves and their weight. |
| Roth, Philip | <i>Nemesis</i> – In 1944 Newark, a devoted playground director sidelined from the war watches in horror as the polio epidemic ravages the city’s children. |
| Towles, Amor | <i>Rules of Civility</i> - An encounter with a banker in a jazz bar on New Year's Eve 1938 catapults a Wall Street secretary into the upper echelons of New York society. |
| Tropper, Jonathan | <i>This is Where I Leave You</i> – A man is thrown together with his dysfunctional family when his father dies while at the same time coping with his wife's infidelity. |

| Winston, Hella | <i>Unchosen</i> – A look at the lives of “rebel” Hasidic Jews, those who are restless and chaffing against the restrictions of their lifestyle. |
