Larsson, Stieg	<i>Millennium Trilogy (The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo; The Girl Who Played with Fire; The Girl Who Kicked the Hornets Nest)</i> - Follows a troubled Goth hacker and a journalist as they investigate the sordid side of Swedish society.
Lavigne, Michael	<i>Not Me</i> – Tells the dramatic and surprising stories of two men, father and son, through sixty years of uncertain memory, distorted history and assumed identity.
Lee, Harper	<i>To Kill a Mockingbird</i> – A girl's father defends a black man accused of raping a white woman in a small Alabama town during the 1930s.

Pintoff, Stefanie	<i>A Curtain Falls</i> - In this sequel to <i>In the Shadow of Gotham</i> , the murders of three Broadway actresses are investigated in turn of the 20^{th} century New York.
Steel, Danielle	<i>Rogue</i> - An amicably divorced couple confronts a life-changing choice after a devastating earthquake.
Verghese, Abraham	<i>Cutting for Stone</i> - Twin brothers who share a love of medicine come of age in an Ethiopia on the brink of revolution, until they are driven apart by betrayal.
Weir, Alison	<i>Captive Queen</i> – Abandoning her marriage to the king of France for Henry II of England, Eleanor of Aquitaine experiences a tumultuous and influential reign.

Hirsi Ali, Ayaan	<i>Infidel</i> – Hirsi Ali, a Somali-born member of the Dutch parliament, tells of her life and her internal struggle with her Muslim faith.
Hirsi Ali, Ayaan	Nomad - Hirsi Ali tells of her coming to America to build a new life, an ocean away from the death threats made to her by European Islamists.
Lindsey, Hal	<i>The Late Great Planet Earth</i> - Published in the 1970s, this book contains Lindsey's insights into biblical prophecy.
Skloot, Rebecca	<i>The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks</i> – The story of a cell line used in research around the world and the woman from whom the cells were taken.

von Drehle, David	<i>Triangle: The Fire That Changed America</i> - The story of the New York City Triangle Shirtwaist factory and the fire that killed 146 workers on March 25, 1911.
