Fiction

- Akhtar, Ayad *American Dervish* – Set in 1980s Milwaukee, a young boy growing up in a dysfunctional family struggles with his religious identity as a Muslim in America.
- Albom, Mitch *Time Keeper* - Father Time, the inventor of the world's first clock, is given one last chance at redemption and must teach two earthly people the true meaning of time.
- Attenberg, Jami *The Middlesteins* – A Midwestern Jewish family is thrown into crisis when a woman's food obsession becomes out of control and puts her health at risk.
- Brennert, Alan *Moloka'i* – In the 1890's, a young girl is separated from her family and sent to a Hawaiian leper colony where she must build a life.
- Brooks, Geraldine *People of the Book* - A book conservationist discovers a series of tiny artifacts in the priceless Sarajevo Haggadah's ancient binding that reveal the history of its survival.
- Clarke, Lucy *Swimming at Night*– Refusing to believe her sister committed suicide in Bali while traveling the world, a young woman follows in her footsteps to try and find the truth.
- Coleman, Reed Farrel *Hurt Machine* - A private investigator investigates the death of his ex-wife's sister, a New York EMT, who was murdered after refusing to provide assistance to a dying man. (Moe Prager mysteries #7)
- DeMille, Nelson *The Panther*– An Anti-Terrorist Task Force agent and his FBI agent wife search for the mastermind behind the bombing of a military vessel, the USS Cole, in Yemen. (John Corey novels #6)
- Deutermann, P.T. *The Last Man* – After his girlfriend goes missing, an American visits Masada where he hopes to prove her theory about the 73 C.E Roman siege of that city.
- Dueñas, Maria *The Time in Between* - Follows the story of a seamstress who becomes the most sought-after couturiere during the Spanish Civil War and World War II.
- Green, Jane *Another Piece of My Heart* – Marrying a divorced father of two, a woman finds herself struggling to gain her stepdaughters' acceptance while preserving family peace.

Grisham, John	<i>The Racketeer</i> – A judge and his secretary are found murdered next to an empty safe and an imprisoned lawyer knows why and will share his explosive secret for a price.
Hawley, Noah	<i>Other People's Weddings</i> - A wedding photographer who has photographed more than a thousand weddings tries to find out years later what happened to the couples.
Hawley, Noah	<i>The Punch</i> - Follows two very different brothers and their alcoholic mother as they disastrously prepare for their father's memorial service.
Hobbs, Roger	<i>Ghostman</i> – A casino robbery gone wrong compels its orchestrator to call in a favor from a mysterious master criminal known only as "Jack."
Mason, Jami	<i>Three Graves Full</i> – Surprised when bodies are found on his property, a man sets a plan into motion to prevent the police from finding the body that <i>he</i> buried in his yard.
McCullough, Colleen	<i>The Prodigal Son</i> – After a report that a lethal toxin has been stolen, a police captain investigates a series of sudden deaths that implicate a rising scientist who has been the target of racism. (Carmine Delmonico Mysteries #4)
Milchman, Jenny	<i>Cover of Snow</i> – After the suicide of her police officer husband, a house restorer in the Adirondacks notices inconsistencies his past and in the behavior of his co-workers.
Mirvis, Tova	<i>The Ladies Auxiliary</i> – When a young widow moves into a close-knit Orthodox Jewish neighborhood in Memphis she becomes an unwitting catalyst for change.
Moyes, Jojo	<i>Me Before You</i> - As an assistant to a quadriplegic former extreme sports enthusiast, a young woman struggles with his acerbic moods and shocking plans for the future.
O'Donnell, Lisa	<i>The Death of Bees</i> – Trying to keep the death of their drug addict parents a secret, two sisters hide their bodies and try to get by with the help of their elderly neighbor.
Patterson, James & Michael Ledwidge	<i>Zoo</i> – When animals, both wild and domesticated, begin coordinated attacks the human race finds itself in a struggle to survive.
Picoult, Jodi	<i>Storyteller</i> – Becoming friends with an old man who's beloved in their community, a woman is shocked when he asks her to kill him and reveals why he deserves to die.
Riggs, Ransom	<i>Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children</i> - A boy explores a strange abandoned orphanage on an island off the coast of Wales after a family tragedy.
Siegel, Andy	<i>Suzy's Case</i> – A personal injury attorney tackles a seemingly unwinnable case involving a young girl who was the victim of malpractice in a Brooklyn hospital.
Spiegelman, Peter	<i>Red Cat</i> -When his brother is harassed by a woman with whom he had an affair, a Manhattan PI investigates and is drawn into a dark and scandalous underworld. (John March novels #3)
Trigiani, Adriana	<i>The Shoemaker's Wife</i> –A sweeping saga of two star-crossed lovers that stretches across the World Wars and from Italy to America and back again.

Into Temptation – Rescued from hardscrabble origins by a wealthy family, a man rises to the head of a publishing company and faces a decision that could prove devastating. (Spoils of Time trilogy #3)

Andersen, Christopher

Mick - As the Rolling Stones mark their 50th anniversary, a #1 New York Times bestselling author presents a no-holds-barred biography of the music icon Mick Jagger.

Bernstein, Harry

The Invisible Wall – The author tells of his life in an English Mill town where Jewish and Christian families lived on the same street but were worlds apart.

Coddington, Grace

Grace- The creative director of Vogue tells of her life in the fashion industry and her journey from model to successful fashion editor.

Caro, Robert A.

The Power Broker – Tells the hidden story behind the shaping and misshaping of twentieth-century New York, both city and state, by power broker Robert Moses.

Dana, Rebecca

Jujitsu Rabbi and the Godless Blonde – Memoir of a not very observant Jewish girl from Pittsburgh who ends up with an ultraconservative rabbi for a roommate in NYC.

Marshall, Penny

My Mother was Nuts – This autobiography is intimate backstage pass to Marshall's personal life and her career as an actress and director.

O'Reilly, Bill

Who's Looking Out for You – O'Reilly tells of the people and institutions who he believes are letting Americans down and what he thinks should be done about it.

Pell, Eve

We Used to Own the Bronx – This former debutante recollects her privileged upbringing and her gradual break with the expectations of her dynastic clan.

Wiesel, Elie

Open Heart - At eighty-two years old, facing emergency heart surgery and his own mortality, this famed writer who survived Auschwitz reflects back on his life.
