Fiction

- Adler-Olsen, Jussi *The Purity of Vengeance* - A Copenhagen detective reopens the cold case of a missing brothel owner when the case is linked to other disappearances. **(Department Q mysteries #4)**
- Albom, Mitch *The First Phone Call From Heaven* – In a Michigan town various people begin receiving phone calls from deceased loved ones - but is it a hoax or a miracle?
- Bird, Sarah *Above the East China Sea*– An army brat moves with her mother to Okinawa and finds that her life is intertwined with that of a young girl who died there during WWII. (Publication date 5/14)
- Bohjalian, Chris *The Light in the Ruins* – An Italian family becomes prisoners when Nazis take over their estate, a situation that leads to a serial murder investigation years later.
- Bohjalian, Chris *Water Witches* – As Vermont faces a drought, a lawyer representing a ski resort that wants to draw water from a local river is challenged by a female shaman.
- Bradley, Alan *The Dead in Their Vaulted Arches*– An 11-year-old girl uses her love of poisons to solve a crime in the English countryside while learning more about her mother. **(Flavia De Luce mysteries #6)**
- Caletti, Deb *He's Gone* – When her husband disappears without a trace from their houseboat in Seattle a woman is forced her to confront unpleasant truths about their relationship.
- Cantor , Jillian *Margot*–Anne Frank's sister survives WWII and is living under an assumed name in Philadelphia when events force her to confront her past.
- Faye, Lyndsay *Seven for a Secret*– Six months after NYPD was founded, an officer investigates a criminal ring who kidnaps free people of color in the North to sell in the South.
- Flagg, Fannie *The All-Girl Filling Station's Last Reunion*- A middle-aged woman receives old documents that turn her world and her beliefs about her family topsy-turvy.
- Healey, Emma *Elizabeth is Missing* – An elderly woman with dementia searches for her best friend convinced she has disappeared, a quest that reawakens memories of a past tragedy. (Publication date 6/14)
- Hosseini, Khaled *And the Mountains Echoed* – This bittersweet family saga spans six decades and transports readers from Afghanistan to France, Greece and the United States.

- Kline, Christina Baker *Orphan Train*– A foster teen performing community service finds out that the elderly, wealthy woman she is helping was sent west on an orphan train as a child.
- Lamb, Wally *We Are Water*–Follows a middle-age artist and her family as she, after twenty-seven years of marriage, divorces her husband to marry a female art dealer.
- Mayhew, Anna Jean *The Dry Grass of August*– In 1954, 13-year-old Jubie, traveling with her family and their black maid, encounters racial tension and tragedy.
- Moore, Edward Kelsey *The Supremes at Earl's All-You-Can-Eat*– Follows three friends who meet at a local eatery in Plainview, Indiana as times change and they grow up.
- Moriarty, Laura *Chaperone* - A novel about the friendship between future movie star Louise Brooks, and the woman who chaperones the teen to New York City for the summer of 1922.
- Moriarty, Liane *The Husband's Secret*– Finding a letter to be opened only when her husband dies a woman is unable to resist reading it and discovers a life shattering secret.
- Moyes, Jojo *Me Before You* - As an assistant to a quadriplegic former extreme sports enthusiast, a young woman struggles with his acerbic moods and shocking plans for the future.
- Picoult, Jodi *Storyteller*– Becoming friends with an old man who's beloved in their community, a woman is shocked when he asks her to kill him and reveals why he deserves to die.
- Quindlen, Anna *Still Life with Bread Crumbs*– Moving to a country cabin, a once world-famous photographer bonds with a local man and begins to see the world in a new light.
- Sendker, Jan Philipp *The Art of Hearing Heartbeats*– When her father goes missing a woman travels to Burma to find him after discovering an old love letter to a woman there.
- Sendker, Jan Philipp *A Well-tempered Heart*– Sequel to *The Art of Hearing Heartbeats*. A Manhattan attorney returns to Burma ten years after her first visit.
- Segal, Francesca *The Innocents*– A man must choose between duty and passion when, after becoming engaged to his girlfriend of 12 years, he finds himself drawn to her cousin.
- Semple, Maria *Where'd You Go, Bernadette*– When her troubled, talented and agoraphobic mother disappears a teenager travels to the end of the earth to find her.
- Sparks, Nicholas *The Longest Ride* -After being trapped in an isolated car crash, the life of an elderly widower becomes entwined with that of a college student and the cowboy she loves.

- Albom, Mitch *Tuesdays With Morrie* – A journalist and best-selling author recounts his weekly visits with a dying teacher who years before had set him straight.
