Baldacci, David

Innocent – A freelance hit man, working for the government, rescues a teenage girl whose parents' disappearance may be linked to a vast, high-level cover-up.

Balson, Ronald

Once We Were Brothers - A respected civic leader and philanthropist is accused of being a Nazi SS officer by a man whose family took him in as a child.

Carner, Talia

Jerusalem Maiden - A young woman living in Jerusalem at the beginning of the 20th century struggles against strict Orthodox traditions to realize her inner artist.

Donohue, Meg

How to Eat a Cupcake - Former friends reunite to open a cupcake shop and try to get past the betrayal that tore them apart while becoming the target of sabotage.

Faye, Lyndsay

The Gods of Gotham - A member of the newly founded NYPD assumes his duties near a notorious slum and stumbles upon a killer who preys on children.

Finney, Jack

Time and Again - A man returns to the year 1882 under hypnosis, where he falls in love and finds a mystery.

Franklin, Tom

Crooked Letter, Crooked Letter - In Mississippi, a black constable must investigate his white boyhood friend when a girl goes missing.

Grisham, John

Litigators – Ambulance chasing lawyers take on a class action lawsuit against the makers of a popular cholesterol-reducing drug suspected of causing heart attacks.

Hays, Tommy

The Pleasure was Mine - Struggling with the loss of his wife after a long period of deterioration, a man experiences new bonds with his widowed son and grandson.

Hoag, Tami

Down the Darkest Road - In 1980s California, a woman whose daughter was abducted moves to a new town, only to find the man she suspects of the crime living there. (Deeper than the Dead novels #3)

Ivey, Eowyn

The Snow Child - A childless couple working a farm in the brutal landscape of 1920 Alaska discover a strange, almost-supernatural child in the wilderness.

James, E.L.	<i>Fifty Shades of Grey</i> - A young literature student interviews a wealthy young entrepreneur who introduces her to an exciting new and erotic world. (Fifty Shades trilogy #1)
Kundera, Milan	<i>The Unbearable Lightness Of Being</i> - Two intertwined couples struggle with relationships and politics in Czechoslovakia after the 1968 Soviet invasion.
Lupton, Rosamund	<i>Afterwards</i> -As she lies gravely injured after saving her daughter from a fire, a woman learns the fire was not accidental and her daughter may be in danger.
McDermid, Val	<i>The Distant Echo</i> - Twenty-five years after an unsolved rape and murder, four friends find themselves targeted by someone who believes that they are guilty.
Moore, Graham	<i>The Sherlockian</i> - A Sherlock Holmes enthusiast investigates a murder related to the author's missing diary, while in the 1890s Conan Doyle hunts a serial killer.
Morgenstern, Erin	<i>The Night Circus</i> - In an enchanted circus two young magicians fall in love despite being rivals in a magical duel.
Otsuka, Julie	<i>When the Emperor Was Divine</i> - This story, told from five different points of view, chronicles the experiences of Japanese Americans sent to internment camps.
Patterson, Richard North	<i>Exile</i> - A successful attorney's life is thrown into turmoil when he is reunited with a Palestinian woman with whom he had a secret love affair in law school.
Picoult, Jodi	<i>Lone Wolf</i> - An estranged son decides to stop his father's life support so that his organs can be donated, a choice his sister opposes.
Richman, Alyson	<i>The Last Van Gogh</i> - This is a fictional account of the last days of Vincent Van Gogh and the artist's relationship with the daughter of his doctor.
Rogan, Charlotte	<i>Lifeboat</i> -A newlywed who survives a harrowing 3 weeks at sea after the sinking of her ocean liner reflects on her and her fellow lifeboat passengers' actions.
Simon, Rachel	<i>The Story of Beautiful Girl</i> -A novel about a woman who can't speak, a man who is deaf, and a widow who finds herself suddenly caring for a newborn baby.
Sin, Kyong-suk	<i>Please Look After Mom</i> - Follows the efforts of a Korean family to find their mother who went missing and their realizations that she may not have been happy.
Sundaresan, Indu	<i>Feast of Roses</i> - Continues the story of the life and times of the intelligent and ambitious wife of Emperor of the Mughal Empire in 17th century India. (Taj Mahal trilogy #2)
Woodrell, Daniel	<i>Winter's Bone</i> -A teen caring for her poverty-stricken family in the harsh Ozarks learns that she will lose her home unless her bail-skipping father can be found.

Non- Fiction

- Ahmad, Imran *The Perfect Gentleman* - A memoir of a Pakistani born man who grows up in London and is torn between his Islamic identity and his desire to embrace the West.
- Araton, Harvey *When the Garden was Eden* - A sports columnist delivers a fascinating look at the 1970s New York Knicks.
- Boo, Katherine *Behind the Beautiful Forever* - A look at the stark lives of the residents of a slum in Mumbai that reveals wrenching inequality and urban poverty that exists in India.
- Fisher, Robin Gaby & Gugliermo, Angelo J. *The Woman Who Wasn't There* - The story of one of the most famous September 11 survivors who wasn't really there when the towers fell.
- The Freedom Writers & Gruwell, Erin *Freedom Writers Diary* – Inspired by their teacher and reading about the Holocaust, inner city students write about their lives.
- Hillenbrand, Laura *Unbroken* – The story of Louie Zamperini, a juvenile delinquent turned Olympic runner turned Army hero and what happened after his plane crashed in the ocean.
- King, David *Death in the City of Light* – The true story of a brutal serial killer who unleashed his own reign of terror in Nazi-Occupied Paris.
- Lagnado, Lucette *The Arrogant Years* - Relates the story of the author's mother, Edith, who came of age in a magical old Cairo, as well as her own story of growing up in America.
- Mack, Stephanie Madoff *The End of Normal* – Memoir from the widow of Mark Madoff and daughter-in-law of Bernard Madoff, who operated one of the largest Ponzi schemes in history.
- O'Reilly, Bill & Dugard, Martin *Killing Lincoln* - A narrative of the heart-stopping events surrounding the assassination of Abraham Lincoln.
- Preston, Douglas & Spezi, Mario *The Monster of Florence* – The search of an author and a journalist to uncover and confront the man they believe to be the serial killer called Monster of Florence.
- Schroff, Laura & Tresniowski, Alex *An Invisible Thread*– The story of an unlikely friendship between a sales executive and an 11 year old panhandler and how the relationship changed their lives.
- Smith, Patti *Just Kids* – Smith tells of her life with Robert Mapplethorpe as struggling artists in New York City during the late 60s and early 70s.
- Zacks, Richard *Island of Vice*– The story of Theodore Roosevelt's war on brothels, gambling joints and after-hours saloons when he was police commissioner of New York.
