Benson, Sally

Meet Me in St. Louis – Tells the story of the Smith family on the eve of the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair. The popular Judy Garland movie was based on this novel.

Flaubert, Gustave

Madame Bovary – The tale of a doctor's wife who, bored and unfulfilled by marriage and motherhood, embarks upon a series of affairs in search of passion.

Larsson, Stieg

The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo - Set in Sweden, a journalist and a Goth hacker team up to investigate a 40 year old disappearance.

Lavigne, Michael

Not Me – Tells the dramatic and surprising stories of two men, father and son, through sixty years of uncertain memory, distorted history, and assumed identity.

McCann, Colum

Let the Great World Spin - Follows a menagerie of New Yorkers through a day in 1974, the day of the daring tightrope walk between the Twin Towers.

Roth, Philip

Indignation - During the Korean War, a young man leaves New Jersey for college in Ohio, trying to escape from his father's fear and apprehension.

Shoneyin, Lola

The Secret Lives of Baba Segi's Wives - Set in contemporary Nigeria, this novel draws one into the complex family dynamics of a polygamous marriage.

Non- Fiction

Bernstein, Harry

The Invisible Wall – The author tells of his life in an English Mill town where Jewish and Christian families lived on the same street but were worlds apart.

Eggers, Dave

Zeitoun - Chronicles the tribulations of Syrian-born Zeitoun who, while aiding in Hurricane Katrina rescue efforts, was inexplicably arrested by the military.

James, Tommy &
Fitzpatrick, Martin

Me, the Mob, and the Music – Tommy James tells how mafia operators made money from rock-and-roll's turbulent adolescence.

- LuPone, Patti ***Patti LuPone*** - One of the theatre's most beloved leading ladies lays it all bare, sharing the intimate story of her life both onstage and off.
- Russert, Tim ***Big Russ and Me*** – This is Russert's memoir and a tribute to his father and the lessons he taught through the years.
- Stahl, Leslie ***Reporting Live*** - In her decades at CBS News, Stahl has seen it all and now she shares her experiences in this behind-the-microphone look at news reporting.
- Weller, Sheila ***Girls Like Us*** - Examines the lives and times of three of the most important female musicians of the sixties: Carole King, Joni Mitchell and Carly Simon.
- Wilkerson, Isabel ***The Warmth of Other Suns*** - Chronicles the decades-long migration of black citizens who fled the South in search of a better life.
