### Fiction

- Barry, Brunonia      *The Map of True Places* - A psychotherapist finds herself on an emotional journey when the suicide of a troubled patient reopens old wounds.
- Bauermeister, Erica      *The School of Essential Ingredients* - Eight students gather every Monday night for a cooking class, but each one seeks a recipe for something beyond the kitchen.
- Blunt, Giles      *Forty Words for Sorrow (John Cardinal Series)* - A troubled Canadian cop and his new partner reinvestigate the disappearance of 5 teens after a body is found.
- Bradley, Alan      *The Weed that Strings the Hangman's Bag (Flavia De Luce Mysteries)* - Precocious, 11-year-old Flavia applies her skills in the chemistry lab in solving the murder of a puppeteer.
- Crowther, Yasmin      *Saffron Kitchen* - When her past resurfaces with tragic consequences, Maryam leaves England for the Iranian village of her youth, confounding her daughter.
- Evaristo, Bernadine      *Blonde Roots* - In an alternate world, in which Africans enslaved Europeans, an Englishwoman is captured and taken to the New World.
- Fforde, Jasper      *Shades of Grey* - Imagines a screwball future in which social castes and protocols are rigidly defined by acuteness of personal color perception.
- Franklin, Ariana      *Mistress of the Art of Death* - A female coroner is hired in secret by Henry II to find out who's murdering Christian children in medieval Cambridge, England.
- Hood, Ann      *The Red Thread* - After a tragedy, a woman founds an adoption agency for Chinese baby girls and learns the stories of both the adoptive and birth parents.
- Howe, Katherine      *The Physick Book of Deliverance Dane* - While cleaning up her grandmother's house a graduate student makes a discovery that links her to the Salem Witch trials.

Larsson, Stieg	<b><i>Millennium Trilogy (The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo; The Girl Who Played with Fire; The Girl Who Kicked the Hornets Nest)</i></b> - Follows a troubled Goth hacker and a journalist as they investigate the sordid side of Swedish society.
Ludlum, Robert	<b><i>The Sigma Protocol</i></b> -When a college buddy tries to kill him in Zurich, it sets off a chain of events that leads an investment banker into a worldwide conspiracy.
Lutz, Lisa	<b><i>The Spellmans Strike Again (Spellman Files Series)</i></b> - In this fourth book about the eccentric Spellman PI clan, a former wild child takes over the family business.
McCall Smith, Alexander	<b><i>The Double Comfort Safari Club (No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency Series)</i></b> -A female detective in Botswana visits a safari lodge where she encounter discontented locals and struggle with untimely wedding issues.
Niffenegger, Audrey	<b><i>The Time Traveler's Wife</i></b> - Clare and Henry vow to hold onto their love as they struggle with a condition that causes Henry to involuntarily travel through time.
Patchett, Ann	<b><i>Run</i></b> - A traffic accident and an act of bravery bring two very different families together and changes their lives.
Picoult, Jodi	<b><i>House Rules</i></b> - A teenage boy with Asperger's Syndrome is wrongly accused of killing his tutor when the police mistake his tics for guilty behavior.
Rose, M.J.	<b><i>TheHypnotist (Reincarnationist Series)</i></b> - A tormented FBI agent discovers that his true conflict resides not in his past, but in a past life.
Sapphire	<b><i>Push (Precious)</i></b> - A teacher opens up a new world for sixteen-year-old Precious Jones, an abused, young, African-American girl living in Harlem.
Toibin, Colm	<b><i>Brooklyn</i></b> - Leaving Ireland to work in 1950's Brooklyn, Eilis Lacey is building a new life for herself when devastating news from home threatens her happiness.
Watson, Jan Elizabeth	<b><i>Asta in the Wings</i></b> – A 7 year-old girl and her older brother are isolated by a delusional mother until an unexpected event pushes them into the outside world.

## Non- Fiction

- Cummins, Jeanine *A Rip in Heaven* - The story of a shocking crime and its aftermath is told by the sister of one of the victims.
- Dreeben, Rochelle *One Dark Night* - The author retells her holocaust experiences from her escape with her mother from the Warsaw Ghetto to her final escape to America.
- Jacobs, A.J. *The Guinea Pig Diaries* - A collection of essays about the author's hilarious experiments, including going undercover as a woman and outsourcing his life
- Lewis, Michael *The Big Short* - A financial journalist investigates what went wrong on Wall Street during the recent economic crisis.
- Nack, William *Secretariat* - A portrait of the Triple Crown-winning champion horse, that set records at the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes.
- Obama, George & Lewis, Damien *Homeland* - The memoir of President Obama's Kenyan half-brother, who went from prison to serving his community.
- Orbach, Jerry, Orbach, Elaine & Bloom, Ken *Remember How I Love You* - The wife of late actor Jerry Orbach created this collection of his poetry and stories from his life as a tribute to him.
- Perkins, John *Confessions of an Economic Hit Man* - The author admits that for 10 years he cajoled and blackmailed less developed countries into serving U.S. interests.
- Zaslow, Jeffrey *The Girls from Ames* - A look at the enduring bond of friendship among a tightly knit group of middle-class, Midwestern women born in the early 1960s.
