Carner, Talia

Jerusalem Maiden - A young woman living in Jerusalem at the beginning of the 20th century struggles against strict Orthodox traditions to realize her inner artist.

James, E.L.

The Fifty Shades Trilogy – This erotic trilogy traces the turbulent relationship between a naive young woman and a sexually experienced, emotionally stunted man.

Flynn, Gillian

Gone Girl - When a woman goes missing her husband, a suspect, realizes that something more disturbing than murder may have occurred.

Duncan, Glen

The Last Werewolf - A 200 year-old werewolf, the last of his kind contemplates suicide until forces that have the power to keep him alive take over his life.

Bohjalian, Chris

The Sandcastle Girls - Parallel stories of a woman in love with a soldier during the Armenian Genocide and a modern-day New Yorker rediscovering her Armenian past.

King, Stephen

11/22/63 - An ordinary schoolteacher travels back in time in order to prevent the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Connelly, Michael

The Brass Verdict - Inheriting a high-profile defense from a murdered colleague,, a lawyer reluctantly teams up with LAPD detective to solve the crime (**Mikey Haller Series #2, Harry Bosch Mysteries #14**)

Koontz, Dean

Watchers Two very different creatures, the end result of experiments in genetic engineering, escape from a government laboratory.

McDermid, Val

The Grave Tattoo– The discovery of a body in a bog gives rise to a search for a missing manuscript regarding Wordsworth's possible ties to the Fletcher Christian.

Glass, Julia

Widower's Tale – A curmudgeonly 70-year-old widower's life changes when he allows a progressive pre-school to take over his barn.

Grisham, John

Calico Joe – Follows the divergent paths of a rookie hitter for the Chicago Cubs and the Mets pitcher whose fastball hits him in the head causing permanent injury.

Grissom, Kathleen	<i>Kitchen House</i> – Working as an indentured servant alongside slaves, a 7-year-old Irish girl finds her light skin places her between two very different worlds.
Hoffman, Alice	<i>The Dovekeepers</i> –The lives of four women intersect in the desperate days of the Roman siege on Masada in ancient Israel.
Horowitz, Anthony	<i>The House of Silk</i> - A year after Sherlock Holmes’s death, Watson recounts a case they shared in 1890 that was “too monstrous, too shocking” to appear in print.
Kingsolver, Barbara	<i>The Lacuna</i> - The story of a man caught between two worlds, Mexico and the United States, spanning the 1930s to the 1950s.
Lavigne, Michael	<i>Not Me</i> – Tells the dramatic and surprising stories of two men, father and son, through sixty years of uncertain memory, distorted history, and assumed identity.
Lehane, Dennis	<i>Live by Night</i> – The tale of one man’s rise from a Boston petty thief to the Gulf Coast’s most successful rum runner during Prohibition in the Roaring Twenties.
Maupin, Armistead.	<i>Tales of the City</i> - The first of six novels about the denizens of a mythic apartment house in San Francisco during the 1970s.
Moriarty, Laura	<i>Chaperone</i> - A novel about the friendship between future movie star Louise Brooks, and the woman who chaperones the teen to New York City for the summer of 1922.
Morton, Kate	<i>The Distant Hours</i> - A lost letter arriving at its destination fifty years after it was sent lures a woman to a castle where her mother was sent to stay during WWII.
Oden, Marilyn Brown	<i>The Dead Saint</i> - A whizzing bullet and a dead New Orleans Saints kicker sends a woman on a worldwide journey of espionage and life-threatening situations. (Bishop Lynn Peterson novels #1)
Quirk, Matthew	<i>The 500</i> – A former con artist and Harvard Law graduate gets in over his head at a sinister consulting firm and is pursued by two of the world's most dangerous men.
Richman, Alyson	<i>The Lost Wife</i> - In pre-war Prague, the dreams of two young lovers are shattered when they are separated by the Nazi invasion.
See, Lisa	<i>Shanghai Girls</i> – Sold to California suitors, sisters from Shanghai struggle to adapt to life in 1930s Los Angeles, while still bound to old customs.
Shapiro, B.A.	<i>The Art Forger</i> - An artist agrees to forge a painting stolen from the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, only to find all is not what it seems.
Shoneyin, Lola	<i>The Secret Lives of Baba Segi’s Wives</i> - Set in contemporary Nigeria, this novel draws one into the complex family dynamics of a polygamous marriage.
Trigiani, Adriana	<i>The Shoemaker’s Wife</i> –A sweeping saga of two star-crossed lovers that stretches across the World Wars and from Italy to America and back again.
Walker, Karen Thompson	<i>Age of Miracles</i> - The coming-of-age story of a young girl whose world is thrown into upheaval when it is discovered that the Earth's rotation has begun to slow.

Winspear, Jacqueline *Elegy for Eddy* – An investigation into a brutal killing takes Maisie from the working-class neighborhoods of her childhood into London's highest circles of power. **(Maisie Dobbs series #9)**

Woodrell, Daniel *The Death of Sweet Mister* – The story of a dysfunctional Missouri family as infidelity threatens to consume their world in violence and terror.

Non- Fiction

Feldman, Deborah *Unorthodox* – Traces the author's upbringing in a Hasidic community in Brooklyn and her struggle to leave and forge her own path in life.

Baez, Jose & Golenbock, Peter *Presumed Innocent* - In this tell-all, the defense lawyer for Casey Anthony, who was acquitted of murdering her daughter, gives an insider look at the trial.

Piatigorsky, Jacqueline *Jump in the Waves* – Miserable, despite being born into the wealthy Rothschild family, the author tells of her life and how she finally found happiness.

Statman, Alisa & Tate, Brie *Restless Souls* – The story of the murder of Sharon Tate by Manson and his followers and its effect on her loved ones told by members of her family.

King, Carole *A Natural Woman* – The author takes us from her early beginnings in Brooklyn, to her remarkable success as one of the world's most acclaimed singer-songwriters.

James, Tommy & Fitzpatrick, Martin *Me, the Mob and the Music* – The author reveals his complex relationship with Roulette Records and Morris Levy, the legendary Godfather of the music business.

Ephron, Nora *Crazy Salad* – Screenwriting legend and novelist Ephron's extremely funny look at a generation of women (and men) who helped shape the way we live now.

Diller, Phyllis *Like a Lampshade in a Whorehouse* - Diller recounts how, against all odds, she became America's first successful and best-loved female stand-up comic.

Adams, Cindy Heller *The Gift of Jazzy* – The true story of a savvy, seemingly tough columnist who is taken prisoner by the love of a tiny Yorkie who taught her about joy and survival.
