

We Keep the Dead Close by Becky Cooper

In 1969, Jane Britton was found bludgeoned to death in her Cambridge, Massachusetts apartment. Forty years later, Becky Cooper a curious undergrad, will hear the first whispers of the story. In the first telling the body was nameless. The story was this: a Harvard student had had an affair with her professor, and the professor had murdered her in the Peabody Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology because she'd threatened to talk about the affair. Though the rumor proves false, the story that unfolds, one that Cooper will follow for ten years, is even more complex: a tale of gender inequality in academia, a 'cowboy culture' among empowered male elites, the silencing effect of institutions, and our compulsion to rewrite the stories of female victims.





The Wife Upstairs by Rachel Hawkins



Newly arrived to Birmingham, Alabama, Jane is a broke dog-walker in Thornfield Estates--a gated community full of McMansions, shiny SUVs, and bored housewives. But her luck changes when she meets Eddie Rochester, who is rich, brooding, and handsome. His wife, Bea, drowned in a boating accident with her best friend, their bodies lost to the deep. Yet as Jane and Eddie fall for each

other, Jane is increasingly haunted by the legend of Bea.


Goodnight Beautiful by Aimee Molloy

Or, it turns out, a life where Annie spends most of her time alone while her therapist husband works long hours in his downstairs office, tending to the egos of his (mostly female) clientele. Little does Sam know that through a vent in his ceiling, every word of his sessions can be heard from the room upstairs. Everything is fine until the French girl in the green mini

Cooper shows up, and Sam decides to go to work and not come home, throwing a wrench into Sam and Annie's happily ever after. Showcasing Molloy's deft ability to subvert norms and culminating in a stunning twist, this is a thrilling tale of domestic suspense that not only questions assumptions but defies expectations.

The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue by V.E. Schwab

France, 1714: in a moment of desperation, a young woman makes a Faustian bargain to live forever and is cursed to be forgotten by everyone she meets. Thus begins the extraordinary life of Addie LaRue, and a dazzling adventure that will play out across centuries and continents, across history and art, as a young woman learns how far she will go to leave her mark on the world.
