Allende, Isabel	<i>The House of Spirits</i> –A Chilean family saga spanning from the beginning of the 20th century to the assassination of President Allende (a relative of the author) in 1973.
Austin, Finola	Bronte's Mistress – In 1843, the married, grieving Lydia Robinson of Thorp Green Hall has a scandalous love affair with her son's tutor, the brother of the Bronte sisters.
Backman, Fredrik	<i>Anxious People</i> – Taken hostage by a failed bank robber while attending an open house, eight anxiety-prone strangers discover unexpected common ground.
Benedict, Marie	The Mystery of Mrs. Christie – Fictional account of what might have happened to Agatha Christie during the 11 days in 1926 when she famously went missing.
Benjamin, Melanie	<i>Mistress of the Ritz</i> - The director of the Hotel Ritz in occupied Paris and his American wife risk their marriage and lives to support the Resistance during WWII.
Bennett, Britt	<i>The Vanishing Half</i> – Twin sisters, inseparable as children, ultimately choose to live in two very different worlds, one black and one white.
Bennet, S.J.	<i>The Windsor Knot</i> – Queen Elizabeth II and her private secretary, Rozie Oshodi, undertake an investigation when a pianist is murdered at Windsor Castle.
Brooks, Geraldine	People of the Book –A book conservator analyzes a priceless 600-year-old Jewish prayer book and discovers a series of artifacts which are linked to the book's history.
Clark, Julie	<i>The Last Flight</i> – Two women on the run impulsively swap airline tickets when an accident forces one of them to assume the other's identity.
Cole, Alyssa	<i>When No One is Watching</i> – A Brooklyn woman uncovers sinister truths about a regional gentrification project and why her neighbors are disappearing.
Connolly, John	<i>The Dirty South</i> – Goes back to PI Charlie Parker's first case in which his efforts to bring his wife and child's killer to justice are stymied by corruption. (Charlie Parker novels #18)
Cummins, Jeanine	<i>American Dirt</i> – A Mexican bookshop owner and her son flee to America after cartel violence takes their entire family and they encounter many dangers along the way.
Downing, Samantha	<i>He Started It</i> –When their wealthy grandfather dies, three adult siblings are required to recreate a fateful road trip they took as children in order to claim their inheritance.
Feldman, Ellen	Paris Never Leaves You – A Parisian with a new life in NY, hides her history with a German officer during WWII, but her daughter has questions about their past.

Fellowes, Jessica	<i>The Mitford Murders</i> – In 1920, when a nurse is killed on a train, a nursery maid and the Lord's eldest daughter become entangled in the murderer's crimes. (Mitford Murders #1)
Foley, Lucy	<i>The Guest List</i> – A celebrity wedding on an Irish island ends in death. Who died? Why? Was it murder or an accident? Read and find out.
Follett, Ken	<i>The Evening and the Morning</i> – Prequel to <i>The Pillars of the Earth.</i> Follows the experiences of three people during the 10th century Viking attacks on England.
Gaige, Amity	<i>The Sea Wife</i> - A young family escapes suburbia for a year-long sailing trip that upends all of their lives, told from the perspectives of both husband and wife.
Gailey, Sarah	<i>The Echo Wife</i> – A scientist's husband has been cheating on her with her genetically cloned replica. When he is murdered, the two women must cooperate with each other.
Haig, Matt	<i>Midnight Library</i> – A woman visits a unique library where every book she chooses is one that she becomes part of and is a possible life she might have led.
Harrow, Alix	<i>The Once and Future Witches</i> – In the late 1800s, three sisters use witchcraft to change the course of history in this novel of magic amid the suffragette movement.
Hawkins, Rachel	<i>The Wife Upstairs</i> – A penniless woman calling herself Jane meets recent widower Eddie Rochester-whose wealthy wife went missing and was presumed drowned.
Hilderbrand, Elin	28 Summers – Inspired by the film, <i>Same Time Next Year</i> . A man's discovery of his mother's long-term relationship with the husband of a Presidential frontrunner.
Hoffman, Alice	<i>Practical Magic</i> – Story of how three generations of New England women deal with the irresistible forces of love and magic.
Hyde, Catherine Ryan	<i>Have You Seen Luis Valez?</i> - A lonely boy and a Holocaust survivor develop an unlikely friendship while trying to track down the woman's missing caretaker.
Kidd, Sue Monk	<i>The Book of Longing</i> – Ana is an educated young woman who longs to write and ends up marrying Jesus of Nazareth in this "what if?" story.
Kim, Nancy Jooyoun	<i>Last Story of Mina Lee</i> –Suspecting that her mother's death was foul play, a woman investigates her mother's past as a Korean War orphan and undocumented immigrant.
Krueger, William Kent	<i>This Tender Land</i> – Fleeing the Depression-era school for Native American children who have been taken from their parents, four orphans share a summer.
Larsen, Nella	Passing – Tells the story of two light-skinned black women who pass for white in a deeply segregated world and the rewards and dangers this life presented.
Lawhon, Ariel	<i>Code Name Helene</i> – A novel based on the real-life story of socialite-spy Nancy Wake, the amazing woman who became one of the most decorated women in WWII.
Lemmie, Asha	<i>Fifty Words for Rain</i> – An illegitimate child of mixed heritage in 1948 Kyoto forges a bond with her older half-brother against the wishes of their formidable grandparents.

Macallister, Greer	<i>The Arctic Fury</i> – Leading an all female expedition into the Arctic, a women survives the harrowing quest only to find herself on trial for murder.
Michaelides, Alex	<i>The Silent Patient</i> – A therapist becomes obsessed with uncovering the truth about what prompted his client, an artist who refuses to speak, to murder her husband.
Miranda,Megan	<i>The Girl From Widow Hill</i> - Years after she was famous for surviving a storm as a child, a woman in hiding finds a dead body when she begins to sleepwalk again.
Park, Linda Sue	A Long Walk to Water- During Sudanese civil war in 1985, an 11-year-old is separated from his family and must walk to find a safe haven. Based on a true story.
Picoult, Jodi	<i>The Book of Two Ways</i> - Surviving a plane crash, an end-of-life doula envisions two disparate paths that find her staying with her family or reconnecting with the past.
Russell, Kate Elizabeth	My Dark Vanessa-Asked to help defend her high-school teacher with whom she had an "affair" at age 15, Vanessa is torn between her teen illusions and adult perceptions.
Russell, Mary Doria	<i>The Women of the Copper Country</i> –Inspired by the life of Annie Clements, telling how in 1913 she led a strike against the world's largest copper-mining company.
Schwab, Victoria	<i>The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue</i> – Making a Faustian bargain to live forever but never be remembered, a woman from early 18th-century France endures lifetimes.
Skeslien Charles, Janet	<i>The Paris Library</i> – A teenager befriends an elderly neighbor and uncovers her past as a librarian at the American Library in Paris and as part of the Resistance during WWII.
Spielman, Lori Nelson	<i>The Life List</i> — After her mother's death a woman learns the only way to get her inheritance is if she fulfills a set of life goals she wrote 20 years ago.
Verant, Samantha	<i>Secret French Recipes of Sophie Valroux</i> – An ambitious chef who loses everything to a sabotaging rival makes a life-changing move to her ailing grandmother's château.
Walter, Jess	<i>Beautiful Ruins</i> – Tells of an almost-love affair that begins in Italy in 1962 and is rekindled in Hollywood 50 later between an Italian housekeeper and a starlet.
Ware, Ruth	<i>The Turn of the Key</i> – When job at a smart-home in Scotland ends with a nanny in prision for a child's murder, she struggles to explain the events that got her there.
Whitehead, Colson	<i>Nickel Boys</i> – The story of two black boys sentenced to the Nickel Academy, a hellish reformatory in Jim Crow-era Tallahassee, Florida-based on a real school.
Wiggs, Susan	<i>The Lost and Found Bookshop</i> – Inheriting her mother's San Francisco bookshop in the wake of a tragedy, a woman discovers family secrets as she rebuilds her life.

Larson, Erik	<i>The Splendid and the Vile</i> – A portrait of Winston Churchill that explores his day-to-day experiences during the Blitz and his role in uniting England.
Macintyre, Ben	<i>Agent Sonya</i> – Reveals the story of the female spy hidden in plain sight who set the stage for the Cold Warone of the last great intelligence secrets of the 20th century.
