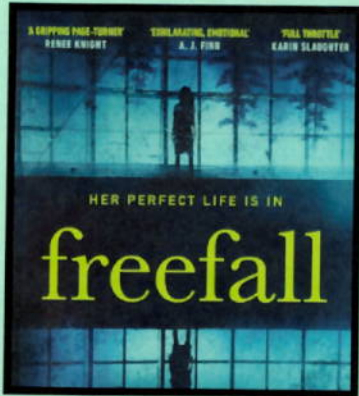

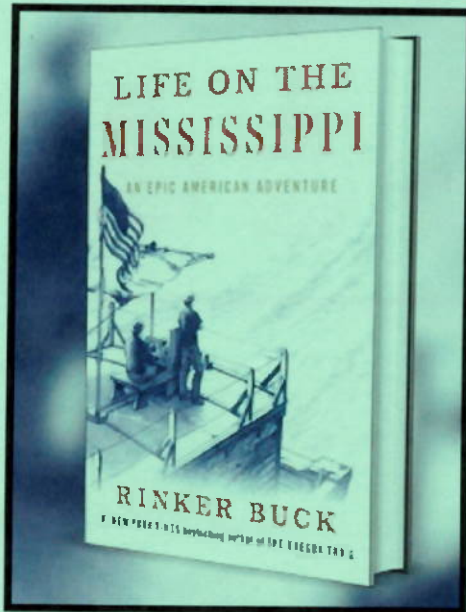


It's a Mystery!

NON-FICTION BOOK GROUP

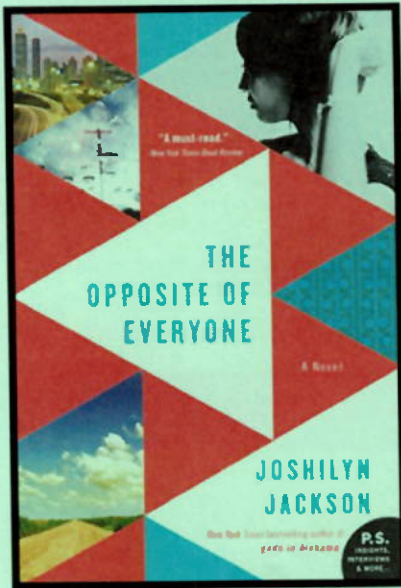
