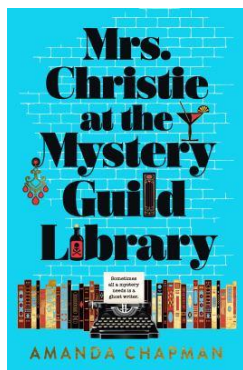


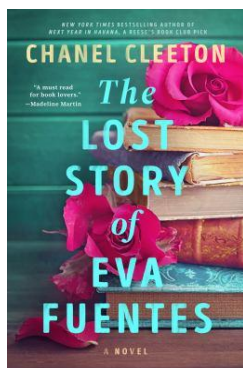
Buckeye by Patrick Ryan

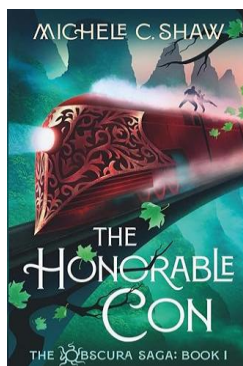
Mrs. Christie At The Mystery Guild Library by Amanda Chapman

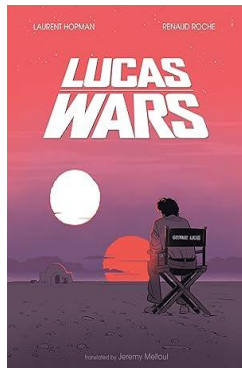
The Lost Story of Eva Fuentes by Chanel Cleeton

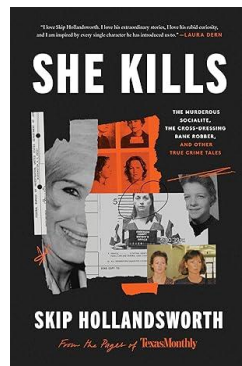
The Honorable Con by Michele C. Shaw

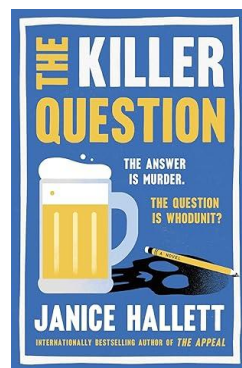
Lucas Wars by Laurent Hopman and Renaud Roche

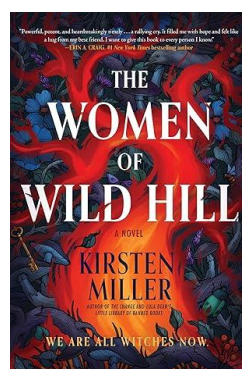
She Kills by Skip Hollandsworth

This book brings together beloved stories that focus in particular on female perpetrators - from the high schooler who was so desperate to move back in with Mom that she had no choice but to poison her father's refried beans, to the wallflower nurse in small-town Texas who one day started killing off her patients, to the lovelorn dental hygienist who ordered a hit on her rival. This is a jaw-dropping, addictively readable compendium of women whose often sensational crimes and circumstances put them on the wrong side of the law.

This thrilling mystery takes place at a pub's weekly trivia night, revealed through quiz categories, phone messages, and email correspondence. Sue and Mal Eastwood run an isolated rural pub called The Case is Altered where a weekly trivia game has revived its flagging fortunes - that is, until a body is found in the nearby river. Soon after, a mysterious new team arrives and shakes up the diverse field of regulars by scoring top marks in every round...every week. Meanwhile, Sue and Mal have a secret of their own. Five years later, the pub lies derelict - what happened?



The Women of Wild Hill by Kirsten Miller
