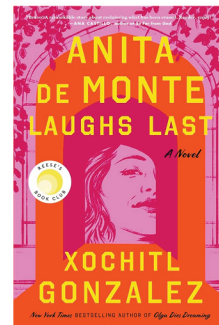

After Raquel becomes romantically involved with a well-connected older art student, she attempts to straddle both worlds. When she stumbles upon Anita's story, it raises questions about their relationship, which eerily mirrors that of the forgotten artist. Anita de Monte Laughs Last is a propulsive, witty examination of power, love, and art.



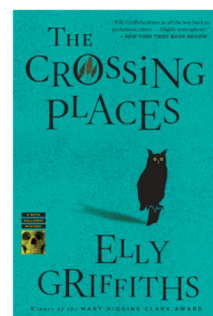
